

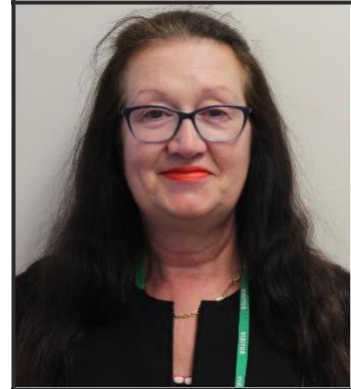
## MEET THE GOVERNORS

## SYEDA HUSSAIN

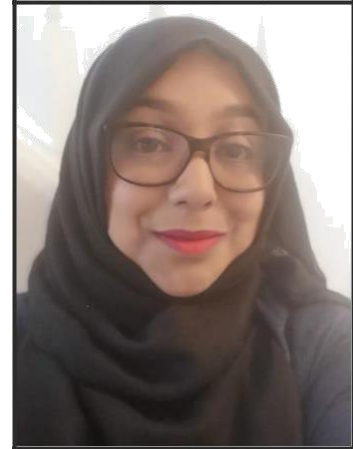
